What is the "Adopt-A Road" Program?

Keep Meriwether Beautiful sponsors the "Adopt-A Road" program. The objective of the "Adopt-A Road" program is to attract public involvement and volunteer efforts to Keep Meriwether Beautiful.

Who Can Adopt?

Any civic-minded organization, (such as Garden Clubs, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Church Groups, Junior or Senior High School Student Councils, FFA/FHA, Rotary Clubs, business, individual or family), etc. can adopt a stretch of highway, county road, or unsightly area in our community.

What Are the Responsibilities of an Adopting Organization?

The adopting organization has the responsibility of picking up litter and sprucing up the adopted area. If appropriate, the organization may also desire to coordinate planting and landscaping of areas. In addition, the organization will:

- Plan for a general cleanup/spruce-up four times a year, two of which will be in conjunction with the Great American Cleanup held in the spring and fall of each year.
- Coordinate with Keep Meriwether Beautiful when volunteers will be working on the adopted areas.

What Are the Responsibilities of Keep Meriwether Beautiful?

Keep Meriwether Beautiful will:

- Coordinate with the appropriate governmental bodies to furnish and erect signs recognizing the organization responsible for the adoption.
- Coordinate media coverage to inform the public of the program.
- Provide assistance and project coordination for all "Adopt-A Road" programs.

Are There Safety Precautions for the Volunteers?

All organizations should make volunteers aware of the dangers of working along the side of the roadway. Keep Meriwether Beautiful will provide bags and gloves to all volunteers.

What is the Objective of "Adopt-A Road" Programs?

The objective of the program is to make all of Meriwether County a "Clean and Beautiful" place to live and work. The program also hopes to increase community pride by involving a large number of volunteers in this effort.
